

EMS was able to wake up the male still seated in the driver's seat with the vehicles engine still running. The operator was identified to me as CYR, Nicholas, dob-10/14/81 oln- S27234151. I asked CYR were he was coming from and he stated that he was performing security for the Boston Red Sox at a function called the "Beckett Bowl". CR.Y states he had only one beer at the function and he said he just fell asleep while driving. I asked CYR to perform field sobriety test to which he agreed. CYR passed all tests and had NO odor of alcohol coming from his person.

CRY stated he was attempting to get home to Weymouth when he passed out. CYR's vehicle was stopped in the opposite travel lane sideways. I felt CYR was still not able to operate his vehicle safely. CYR still seemed to be out of it. CYR was unable to understand simple directions and still seemed to be sleepy. I requested H6 to send me a wrecker to remove CYR's vehicle.

Due to the vehicle being towed I performed a vehicle inventory per department policy. While going through the vehicles center console I observed a clear bag containing 9 white powder capsules. Under the bag I located a brown bottle of liquid labeled Anadrol 50MG. I secured these items in my cruiser and went over to speak to CYR. I read CYR his Miranda rights and asked him if he would like to talk to me about what I found in his vehicle. CYR agreed and told me he had steroids in the vehicle. The bottle of Anadrol was ¼ full. CYR stated he used the steroid orally but hasn't used it in a few days. I asked CYR what the white powder pills were and he stated he wasn't sure. I asked CYR where he had got the steroids and he stated he had bought the bottle along with the pills for \$80.00. I asked CYR who he had bought the steroids from and he told me a guy he works for with within the Boston Red Sox named Jarrod Remy. I repeated the name and he said "you know Jerry Remy's son". CYR was allowed to call his mother for a ride due to having no cash on him for a cab.

A short time later City Side towing arrived to remove the vehicle. At about the same time Mrs. CYR showed up to pick up her son. When she arrived she went over to speak with her son. After leaving him she approached me and asked if she could talk to me. I agreed and Mrs. CYR stated she knew that Jarrod Remy sold her son the steroids and she continued saying she warned him to stay away from him.

At approx 0530 hours I deposited the steroids and the pills in to the H6 evidence safe. Tpr Shawn Newman of Norfolk County CPAC was notified of the information.

CYR was issued Mass citation # M6981788 in hand for 90/24E, operating to endanger and 94C/E possession of class E substance Steroids'.
